#### BACKGROUND

- Challenge (SAP 2010):
  - Major Eclipse Release every year
  - Two Support Releases in the following 9 months
  - No service releases after that
  - Discrepancy between support obligation towards customers (12y) and defined support for Eclipse (1y)

## PROBLEM

- Eclipse is becoming main-stream technology, long-term support is becoming important to customers and adopters
- No one company con offer appropriate long-term support for all relevant projects of Eclipse

## INITIATIVE

- Goal: Provide sustainable support model for long-term support and maintenance of Eclipse technology
- 2009: Early conversations in membership (SAP, EclipseSource, others)
- 2010
  - Formal request to EMO to develop plan for LTS
  - Outreach to various organizations ("Customers", "Integrators", "Specialist Companies")


## STAKE HOLDERS

## ECLIPSE BINARY LICENCE

- Binaries produced by LTS infrastructure will be distributed under the EBL
- Only binaries, no source, but may acknowledge that the source code is available under various open source licenses
- Permission for world-wide, royalty free distributions of such binaries via distributors and sub-licensors
- No permission to create derivative works of binaries

## STATUS

- Presentations at ESE 2010, EclipseCon 2011, other conferences
- Workshop conducted on July 11, 2011 in Walldorf, Germany
- Interested parties include SAP, Airbus, IBM, Ericsson, Bosch, Continental, BMW, MSG-Systems, ATOS Origin, Obeo, Itemis, EclipseSource, CEA List, Red Hat, MSG-Systems
- Plan to establish dedicated industry working group (IWG) in Q4/2012
